### Charity Health Network Expanding

We are happy to announce that we have expanded our clinic operations to the Northern Province in Sierra Leone. While supporting two hospitals in the Northern Province we did not previously have any clinics in region. Now St. John of God Health Center and Community 2 Mile 91 Clinic are both part of the Charity Health Network. Operated by the Clarissian Sisters, Community 2 Mile 91 clinic serves a catchment area of nearly 8,000 providing general medical and emergency services. St. John of God Health Center serves approximately 15,000 and is administered by the Brothers of St. John of God. HealeyIRF looks forward to working with these health facilities and providing much need medical supplies and donations.
